Key identification feature separating from Eastern Yellow was the enclosed ear covert patch. The supercillium extends down and around to enclose the ear coverts. Also greyish crown and mantle differs from greenish colouration of Eastern Yellows that occur in our region. This bird appears to be a first winter plumaged individual with heavily worn retained juvenile remiges. Moult has begun around the head and body feathers with a yellow/buff wash appearing around the head and in isolated patches on the underparts
